

1921- They planned many membership rallies and had treats of ice cream and cake at their social evenings. Christmas boxes were sent to veterans in hospitals and several members sent personal gifts. They voted to send \$10.00 to the State Department to help them carry on their work. A Pot Luck dinner was held for Armistice Day and a short program of vocal solos and Violin solos were enjoyed by all. In December 1921 the first mention of a District meeting was made. The Unit supplied 30 handkerchiefs, 10 pairs of socks, 6 pair of pajamas, 2 bathrobes, 2 sweaters and 5 helmets to the Roosevelt Hospital. A Bake Sale was held and proceeds were used to send Christmas packages to Soldiers in Fairmount Hospital in Kalamazoo. One member, Mrs Doris Williams (The Units first President) donated a quilt top. The Unit purchased a lining and batting and finished the quilt and when finished it was given to the old peoples home. Two more blankets and 2 aprons were donated for the same family. Sewing pajamas was one of the projects that brought out the members on plays with a dessert Pot Luck. Another Theater benefit was given and \$66.00 was realized this time.
