

1922- In March 1922 it was decided to exchange the Unit's temporary Charter for a permanent charter. The Legion Post donated a Workbasket and a pair of silk hose which was raffled off and the proceeds put into the Flower Fund. A project of canned fruit and jellies for the American Legion Hospital, was started. A notice was put in the local paper requesting the townspeople to help with the project. The D. A. R. had a plan to plant trees for each boy from South Haven who was killed or died in service. Two ladies were appointed to meet with the Legion to make plans. The trees were planted with ceremonies and the entire Legion and Auxiliary were assembled on Arbor Day. The Unit subscribed to the "Booster" a paper edited by the boys in Roosevelt Memorial Hospital in Battle Creek. A picnic was held in the park and \$7.70 cleared on the project. There was a booth for the Post and one for the Auxiliary where candy, ice cream, sandwiches and cake and cold drinks were sold. Article 10-section 1 of the Constitution and By-Laws was amended to elect officers in September instead of December. Announcement was made of a District Meeting to be held in Paw Paw in November to elect Committee women. Election of officers showed new offices, a Historian, Publicity, Sergeant at Arms were added. A mother, daughter meeting was held, with each member adopting a lady for her mother, (when she had none). The Unit purchased a book on "Parliamentary Rules for use in Womens Clubs".

Cookies, candies and fruit were sent along with \$25.00 to the Roosevelt American Legion Hospital for a Xmas gift. A Unit Christmas party was held and a donation given to an ex-service man and his family. The man is suffering from Tuberculosis. The "Booster" and the "American Legion Monthly" were placed in the Library.
