

Mrs Lybosker of Saugatuck was the Installing officer for the officers for the year 1924. Solos were sung by a member of the Unit and a social evening followed. \$10.00 was sent to the Childrens Billet for the Emergency Fund. Mrs Lulu Warner Trump-new President reported that 279 quarts of fruit, 4 large boxes of jelly and 57 1/2 dozen cookies were sent to the Roosevelt Hospital. Headdresses were being sold for 30¢ and many of the members had purchased them. Two subscriptions of the "Booster" were ordered. The Unit gave \$5.00 to the Relief Corps to purchase a stove for a Civil War Veteran and \$20.00 to purchase linoleum for the Hall. 250 poppies were purchased. Paper napkins were sold to swell the Treasury - 252 quarts of canned fruit and 1 box dried apples, and 10 boxes of books and magazines were sent to the Roosevelt Hosp. Boxes for money donations for the American Legion Hospital were placed in local business places and resorts., \$26.00 was collected this way. \$10.00 was sent to the Billet for sheets and pillow cases and \$5.00 for boys shirts. Department Convention was to be held in Muskegon. It was voted to send \$5.00 this year to the Service Club at Washington and \$1.00 each year for 5 years. Another Mothers Party was held. District dues of 25¢ per capita were ordered paid. Bake sales and penny marches were continued. Mrs Laura Johnson delivered invitation of Letion that the Auxliary celebrate Armstice Day with them.

worth of Christmas gifts were sent to the American Legion
Hospital at Camp Custer.
