

1927- Five boxes were packed to send to the District Birthday parties to be held at the hospital in January. A rug was purchased for a Veteran's family who wanted to be near him while he was hospitalized in Battle Creek. Members started a letter writing campaign to the Representatives asking support to a bill regarding the American Legion Hospital at Battle Creek. Districts started challenging each other on membership - with the losing district preparing a banquet for the winners. Card Parties, bake sales and rummage sales continued to be a way of earning money for the Unit. At the March meeting, daughters of the members of Unit 49 prepared a dinner which was served to 40 ladies. A program of music recitations and talks followed the dinner. A typewriter was purchased for \$5.00. There was 13 barrels and 9 boxes of clothing of all types sent to the Flood Relief. The women of the Women's Union Congregational Church aided the Unit in collecting the clothing. Members continued to attend the District Meetings and State Conventions, now part of their way was paid by the Unit. \$20.00 sent to American Legion Hospital for Christmas gifts and \$10.00 to Childrens Billet.
