Unit lost membership drive and sent their 50¢ to District Chairman. Reported that 84 children at the Billet. Card Parties continued the last week of every month. Unit paid \$2.00 as their share of Billet Birthday Party. Mothers Day cards were sent to the Gold Star Members and Mothers of Legion members. Unit marched in Flag Day parade. Mrs Elizabeth Bradley a very devoted member passed on and Charter was draped in her honor. \$6.00 was sent to help City of South Haven in building a float for Peach festival. Legion and Auxiliary have a 4th of July carnival on City streets Auxiliary's share of profits were \$36.25. Elections of officers changed to September now. Mrs Pearl Lemke elected President. A Navy Day dance was held in October - Unit sewed layettes for Red Cross. A pledge of \$100.00 to help retire mortgage on Post Home. An afghan was purchased for Veterans Hospital. Mandatory funds were paid as Unit earned \$58.00 on carnival held during Peach festival. \$10.00 was also sent to Goodfellows fund.
