

1941- A pot luck supper started the years activities, with Legion and Auxiliary in attendance. Unit donated \$5.00 for a needy family and arranged for 2 quarts of milk to be delivered daily during the month of January. The quilt was raffled and ~~\$20.00~~ profit made for Father's Day. One hundred ten children at Billet now. Mabel Mohr and Minna Killran investigated local Library for Un-American books and Literature. Unit purchased a Music Box and records for Post Home, and profits from it were put in building fund. Three girls were selected to go to the first Wolverine Girls State, Dottie Dickerson, Patricia Suhr, and Barbara Clarke. Two large coffee pots were purchased for Post Home Kitchen. Unit helped Post on carnival and earned \$120.26. The Unit voted to discontinue the penny march that was held for 21 years. Election of Betty May as President for coming year. Joint installation with Post held in September. Unit purchases some new records for music box. Clarence Christman Captain of Sons of the Legion presented to the Auxiliary, several of the very active boys in the squadron. The boys presented the Post with three pedalstals which they had made. Unit Unit sews three wool dresses and 3 wool skirts for Red Cross Six card tables and 24 chairs were purchased for Post Home. Commander Ernest Lind explained the facts relative to equipping the new Veterans Hospital. The Unit voted to donate \$50.00 toward equipping 1 room.
